STATIONVIEW (Assin Fosu)

We celebrated our 5th Anniversary on Sunday 31st January, 2010 at Stationview church premises. It was a week-celebration which started from Monday 25th - Sunday 31st. Some of the activities were Cleaning & decoration, Children's citation of scriptures, Visitation, Youth Exposure to Worship practice & Games, Deaf drama & singing, Sunday church service & Fellowship Dinner. Sunday church service recorded **194** in attendance comprising of adults, children, and visitors. Giving also recorded US\$140.

ADJETEY CAMP –New Building Dedication

The new church auditorium commissioning was over after 2.00pm in January, 2010 at Adjetey Camp. This function brought together **393 church members** representing their various congregations from within and without Assin Municipality including six (6) Preachers. The Chief and the elders of Adjetey were also present. Because Lawrence Odoom was ill and unable to make the trip, Elder Nicholas Essien of Swedru Church replaced him.

Prizes were given out to some outstanding workers that have contributed greatly towards the up building of Adjetey Church. Ebenezer also presented songbooks, Bibles, and decoration flowers to the church.

Ebenezer's Speech:

HISTORY AND THE COST OF THE BUILDING
(ADJETEY CHURCH OF CHRIST)

Church of Christ, Adjetey Camp was started in the year 1987 by Mr. & Mrs. Abidi. The church was worshiping in a classroom block. Two years later, the church with the membership of eight engaged themselves in Church labour for money to put up their own small building as a meeting place.

After 14 - 15 years, when the members had multiplied and also found the building to be getting structurally weak and weaker, they planned for a new and spacious building in order to accommodate more people both in times of normal church services and special events. Hence the new building we are all witnessing today. **This truly is a major achievement for God's people!**

This building was started on the 3rd February, 2004 and was fully completed in December, 2009 with 45 members from the start of which 24 were men and 21 women. This building cost us both manpower and cash equivalent to **US\$ 6,600**.

With the above mentioned cost, some were loans and free - will offerings. The scriptures tell that what you give to God must cost you highly. As we open and dedicate this building to God, we believe it tells all who we are and for what we stand! **To God Be The Glory !!**
