The Church at Stationview, Anthony Kiranchie & Ebenezer Korsah send "Greetings" to the elders and the saints at Princeton!

Additions to God's Church:

There were ten(10) new baptisms in July and our ytd July total for 2010 is 35; Four new Christians are from our own Stationview congregation and six were from a congregation where we have not been involved before at Assin Worakese, some 10KM away.

Evangelism And Restoration:

Four souls were baptized on Sunday 11th July 2010 into Jesus Christ by Stationview Church of Christ. They have been our study prospects since the middle of June, 2010. We are pleased our home congregation continues to reach out to others!

Ebenezer and Anthony received an invitation from a sister congregation in a village within Assin North Municipality to assist in a gospel campaign. The village is called Assin Worakese, located some 10km away from Assin Fosu. This congregation has been in existence for seven (7) years now without any evangelistic duties or gospel campaign. This has resulted in the church nearly collapsing. So this was a three-day gospel campaign call for revival from Thursday 15th – Saturday 17th July. The activities were Dawn Preaching, Day-time house to house Bible studies and nightly street preaching. Average attendance of listeners was 130 daily, which was fantastic! This campaign ended successfully with **six (6) souls baptized and six (6) souls restored.**

Deaf Brethren:

VISITING DEAF BROTHERS IN TAKORADI CENTRAL CHURCH On Sunday 18th July, 2010, deaf brethren in Stationview traveled, visiting their fellow deaf Christians in Takoradi church where Ebenezer attended his first Bible College and had Diploma in Biblical Studies. Takoradi is in the Western Region of Ghana, a distance of about 120km away from Assin Fosu. In all, sixteen (16) deaf people made this journey including myself. Other thirteen (13) deaf people who are also members of Stationview could not be part of this journey because they are students in schools not yet vacated.

We were warmly welcomed, worshipped together and enjoyed a Fellowship Dinner. The leadership of the church, also the leadership of the College, expressed their pleasure in Ebenezer's ministry as a product of their Bible College and many nice compliments were received!

Area Congregations Members Retreat:

Remember, none of our area congregations have Elders or Deacons. Therefore, we operate via committees and their Chairpersons and Members are vital to various works!

A Committee One Day Retreat was held for area congregations on July 24. Some Twenty-Four committee members from the following congregations were represented: Stationview, Juaso, Brofoyedur, Ketukrom and Adjetey Camp. Ebenezer and Anthony conducted the day long sessions. It was organized in a manner that echoes biblical studies and prayers, allowing them to set their hearts more fully before God. The THEME was **"PRESENT YOURSELF TO GOD AS ONE APPROVED" (II TIM. 2:15).**

Anthony led Prayers and General Discussions as well. Ebenezer also spoke on two topics namely; **"LEADERSHIP PORTRAITS"** and **"A GUIDE TO CHURCH GROWTH"**. Photos and copies of the

Radio Station Bible Program to be Launched at our town of Assin Fosu:

You will recall our strong interest in having a local radio program on a new station. This was reported on in the June Report, but some is repeated here because this new effort can be the boldest effort yet for the cause of Christ in our area. Their radio signal covers hundreds of square miles.

Max Lancaster has indicated that the current mission budget at PCC could cover \$30/weekly for a trial period of four months if StationView would commit to the \$20/week balance. **StationView has accepted that challenge and this project is a GO for September!!!**

This radio preaching is now the easiest means to reach thousands of people with the truth each week. This is because this Radio Station covers Greater Accra Region, Ashanti Region, Central Region, Assin North Municipality and Assin South District. Yes, it is appreciated you might NOT have a Ghana map, but you can understand the spread of the Gospel to a much larger area!

We only need personal commitment to do follow- ups and God's intervention. When it turns positive, it becomes a great harvest cutting across the boundaries. This does not mean we are putting aside our usual house to house evangelism, no, it also continues. So I am happy PCC and partner StationView are coming up this way.

It may still be necessary for financial help on this project starting January 2011 after our trial, as I know we will be successful, so I ask you to pray about its success and financing!
