**Additions to God's Church:**

There were five (5) new baptisms in June and our ytd total for first half of 2010 is 25. It is impossible to explain the negative impact of the horrific rains Ghana has experienced in recent weeks and it has affected all we do! There has been wide-spread destruction and many deaths.

**Rainfall:**

As I have already told you, it has rained heavily throughout Ghana for many weeks now. Flood and disaster has occurred and destroyed many buildings and properties in places such as Agona Swedru, Accra, Winneba, etc. Travel away from the larger cities is most difficult.

Our mutual friend and evangelist, **Lawrence Odoom**, experienced loss of a business and the Agona church building was damaged. Further, malaria is now a grave problem and Lawrence's congregation of 500+ at Agona has had two deaths due to malaria. As you know, I am quite susceptible to this disease and am taking necessary precautions as best as I can.

This has hindered a lot of Church programs, activities and meetings. Pray for our safety, but know that we are coping with it all! The rains will end at some point!

**Campus Ministry:**

As part of the campus ministry, "Handing Over Ceremony and Fund Raising" was conducted at Fosco for the Church of Christ student congregation. The 2009/2010 group of students were finishing their studies in the college. Hence the need to handover to the 2010/2011 new students. We were considerably encouraged by the large attendance of 163, both Christians and visitors. Immediately after the close of this program, five souls were baptized.

The fund raising was aimed at their proposed gospel campaign as a student congregation to assist the work at Ketukrom come 4th-7<sup>th</sup> August, 2010.

At the gathering, **Ebenezer and Anthony** both addressed the outgoing graduates to encourage them to be faithful wherever they go!

A town by name, Assin Manso, a 16km away from Assin Fosu has a second cycle institution. (Second cycle is a TWO year education program.) It's a place where we recently launched an official inauguration of another campus ministry with the membership of 25. They also registered their presence during the program.

**Purchased Bibles:**

I am grateful that PCC member Cheryl Whitehouse has given a gift of Bibles to us. We are humbled by her generosity in remembering us! The receivers of the Bibles have attached seriousness in their use. We would welcome the generosity of a gift from any PCC member. The bibles cost \$10 each and will be earned and used!

**Radio Station Bible Program to be Launched at our town of Assin Fosu:**

You will recall our strong interest in having a local radio program on a new station. Radio Station NKWA F.M. (88MHZ) was launched a few months ago. Their frequency travels more than a hundred and twenty (120) km. The name 'NKWA' is a local language meaning 'LIFE'. This F.M. Station can help teach and spread the truth region-wide. A weekly 30 minute radio program cost \$50.

Max Lancaster has indicated that the current mission budget at PCC could cover \$30/weekly for a trial period of four months if StationView would commit to the \$20/week balance. **StationView has accepted that challenge and this project is a GO for September!!!**

This radio preaching is now the easiest means to reach thousands of people with the truth each week. This is because this Radio Station covers Greater Accra Region, Ashanti Region, Central Region, Assin North Municipality and Assin South District. Yes, it is appreciated you might NOT have a Ghana map, but you can understand the spread of the Gospel to a much larger area!

We only need personal commitment to do follow-ups and God's intervention. When it turns positive, it becomes a great harvest cutting across the boundaries. This does not mean we are putting aside our usual house to house evangelism, no, it also continues. So I am happy PCC and partner StationView are coming up this way.

It may still be necessary for financial help on this project starting January 2011 after our trial, as I know we will be successful, so I ask you to pray about its success and financing!

**Personal:**

I have to travel some 75 KM to Cape Coast to use the internet and do so only once per month; yes, it is difficult, but currently necessary; it will not always be so, but for now, there are other more pressing needs such as the Radio Program, about which, I am so grateful and enthusiastic! I am grateful to the PCC Elders and Max for the Radio Program support as well as Bibles, etc....
